


This month's TOP recommended reads



Behold the savage spectacle of Wild Boy! Ladies and Gentlemen, take your seats. The show is about to begin.


WINNER of the Leeds Book Award, the Brilliant Book Award, East Sussex Book Award, Phoenix Award and the Sakura Medal.

A selection of books promoted in our in-house school reading scheme. Each of these books are worth gold reading award and worth 15 Pride Points.




Recommended Reads about Science




Historical Fiction | Adventure | Animal




Autobiographical

The weekend has only just begun . . .


